

Overcoming the death of the late chairman

In March of 1995, the late chairman was suddenly struck down by a cerebral hemorrhage. He recovered in two months, and this experience made him change

his view on the Shinkiko therapy, significantly. Everything that occurs has a meaning, and it is important to learn from what has occurred. The Shinkiko energy is the light not just to heal your physical body but to provide energy to your soul and encourage spiritual awakening. The late chairman made a tour of seminars where he delivered these messages. In December of the same year that he completed his tour across Japan, from Hokkaido to

The late chairman graduated from junior high school and then acquired watchmaking skills. Had it not been for those skills, he would not have been able to build the High Genki transferring machine, and the Shinkiko therapy would not have been formed.

Also, the fact that my health became poor, and the fact that things went smoothly without major confusion from the time my father once fell ill until his death, leads me to believe this was all carried out according to some kind of plan on a vast scale, which was arranged in the distant past. What I mean is that the universe

made us play our roles. It had my father produce a transferring machine, and had me, a former engineer, succeed that role and improve the

efficiency of the Ki transferring machine to make it available to many people.

In my case, the skills I obtained through my former job as an engineer were a great benefit. In the beginning I was just taking care of whatever came in front of me but gradually I realized that what I was facing at that time became like a line connecting dots which became an arrow showing me the direction. Without the experience from my former job, I would not have been able to come up with the idea of most of the current Ki goods and various parts to reinforce the High Genki.

There is no such thing as a useless experience, because experiences can turn out to be useful over time. I realized that even though we do not notice the meaning of each experience at the time, later we will see that everything is connected. I cannot be more thankful for the existence of the grand universe that allows us to live.
